To help your child to make good progress they should be reading daily.

Use the ideas below to help you.

Can your child...

Look at the front cover, locate and read

- The title, author, and the illustrator
- Talk about the picture
- Read the blurb together
- What might this book be about?
- Is it fiction or non-fiction book?

Look at the book together

- Who are the characters in the book?
- Where does the story take place?
- Non-fiction identify the contents and index and discuss how they can help us to read the book
- Look at where the capital letters and full stops are
- Use blending to read unknown words
- Read tricky words was, you, my, are, her, all, they, said
- Begin to read tricky words have, like, so, do, some, come, little, one, were, there, what, when, out.

Talk about the book

Fiction:

- What was your favourite part? Why?
- Who are the characters in the story?
- What happened in the book?
- Why is she/he happy/sad?
- What is she/he doing?
- What will happen next?

Non-fiction:

- What is the book about?
- Who is the author of the text?
- What is the book called?
- Tell me something you found out from reading the book
- What kind of things would you expect to see in this book?
- Find something that interests you from the text. Explain why you chose that particular part.
