To help your child to make good progress they should be reading daily.

Use the ideas below to help you.

## Can your child...

#### Look at the front cover

• Identify the key features and discuss what the book might be about.

### Look at the book together

- Read a variety of texts including looking at a poem in depth, dictionaries, plays, leaflets and books by the same author
- Read to self at times, as well as others
- Discuss the main characters in the story and how they affect each other
- Attempt different voices for the characters in a story, taking account of punctuation such as speech marks
- Read accurately most words of two or more syllables
- Non-fiction text noting that the contents page is in page order and the index is in alphabetical order. Look at the glossary what is it used for?

# Talk about the book

#### Fiction:

- Check what their reading makes sense to them, correcting any inaccurate reading.
- Explain what has happened so far in what they have read.
- Suggest different ending for the story book.
- Answer inference style questions such as:
- Why do you think...?
- How do you know that...?
- What might happen if...?
- Why do they...? How do you know...?

### Non-fiction:

- What kind of a text is this? How do you know?
- How does the layout help the reader?
- Have you found any of the illustrations, diagrams or pictures useful? Why/why not? Try to explain fully.
- Why did the writer choose to present the information in the way they did?
