To help your child to make good progress they should be reading daily.

Use the ideas below to help you.

Can your child...

Look at the front cover, and locate and read

- The title, author, and the illustrator
- Talk about the picture
- Read the blurb together
- What might this book be about?
- Is it fiction or non-fiction book?

Look at the book together

- Talk about the pictures, what is happening, the characters
- Blend phonemes to read unknown words
- Blend taught digraphs to read unknown words
- Point to words as they read
- Read simple sentences
- Pick up and say repeated phrases
- Read tricky words he, she, we, me, be
- Begin to read tricky words was, you, they, all, are, my, her, said

Talk about the book

Fiction:

- Where and when does the story take place?
- What did the character look like and where did the character live?
- Who are the key characters in the book?
- What do you think might happen next?
- What kinds of people are there in the story?
- What is happening in this picture?

Non-fiction:

- What kind of book is this? How do you know?
- What is this book about? What could you find out from this book?
- Which parts of the book could help us to find the information we need?
- What is a glossary? What is a contents page?
- What is an index? How do you use it?
- What makes it different from a story?
