<p>Let's explore comparing different amounts together. Watch the video on Tuesday to find out more. Then have a try at drawing some flowers using different amounts of coloured petals.</p>	<p>Bees love flowers. Do you know any different types of flowers? Use the spotter sheet (link above) to see which ones you can find on a walk. If you spot flowers not on the sheet can you find out what they are called?</p>	<p>What letter sound does the word 'Bee' begin with? Watch our video on Thursday to learn about the letter 'b' and make some silly soup with Mrs Godbold.</p>

Download and print the Minibeast I spy and count to 10 sheet from Twinkl. Which animal was there the most of? How many bees did you count? If you cannot download this then find several groups of objects of different amounts and ask your child to count them to find out how many there are of each.</p>	<p>Have a go at creating your own story about a bee. Think about what the bee could be called and what it looks like. How could you start the story? What happens to the bee? Does it get lost or go on a trip somewhere? Finally think about how your story will end. Good luck!</p>

Can you move or dance to the music? Are your movements going to be fast or slow?</p>	<p>Do you know what food Bees make? Have a go at making one of these recipes using honey.
