Remote Learning

We sincerely hope not, but there may be times across the course of this academic year when your child has to remain at home and carry out their learning from there.



For Year 1 and 2 children their schooling work will be provided to you remotely via Google Classroom. Year 2 children will be very familiar with this but it will be new to our Year 1 children. All the children belong to their own class google classroom but you will need to join the classroom in order to be able to access it. Shortly, you will find a ticket in the front of your child's home learning book which details their unique email address and password. You will need to log on to their email and find the invite to join the classroom. Year 2 parents please note that as they are now in a new class, their google classroom account has been moved and you will need to join again in the new classroom.

Our reception children will use Tapestry as their platform for remote learning. Whilst Tapestry may be new to some of you, you will quickly become very familiar with it.



Parents Evening

This year we will once again be using School Cloud Parents Evening. Although times have changed slightly with regards to the pandemic we actually felt that School Cloud was a successful way to run parents evenings and meant that we could update you on your child's progress without the added complication of attending school. It also means that we run exactly to time!

For those new to this we will send out details nearer the time but in short you are invited via email to book a time with your child's class teacher, you then receive an email confirming your time and at the bottom of that email there is a link to click on at your allotted time where you will then link virtually to your child's class teacher. Appointments are set at 10 minutes and the system ends them after this time hence why teachers always run to time!

Our Autumn Term Parents evenings will be on **Tuesday 16th November** and **Wednesday 17th November** for your diaries but an email inviting you to book an appointment will be sent out in due course.



Additional Day

Next year marks the Queen's platinum Jubilee and so she has kindly granted an additional bank holiday in June next year. This additional bank holiday falls in the normal school holidays so in lieu of that the Local Authority have authorised schools to shorten the school year by a day just for this academic year.

The Aylsham Learning Federation have chosen **Friday 22nd October** as our day and therefore school and nursery will be closed on this day to all children and staff. This extends the half term holiday by a day.


If you are thinking about returning to work, career progression options or training to work in a new industry this certificate may be a useful addition to your CV.
