#### Read Write Inc

The children have all done brilliantly this half term considering it was such a short one and they only had 3 weeks between assessments! Remember if your child is on Yellow, Blue or Grey level this is one where they have a whole term in order to consolidate their reading and especially their fluency.

Just a reminder that the children's book wallets need to be taken out for reading but then put back in their book bags so that they are always in school.

Recently we have had a number of families who have mislaid their books or they have not been taken care of. Whilst we definitely want the children to read they do need to be taught how to respect property an this includes our books. When we do not have books returned this costs the school to replace them. Budgets in schools are extremely tight and money spent on lost or ruined books means less money for other areas of schooling.

Please can we all try hard to keep book wallets in book bags, look after our books and have a hunt for those that have been lost.


## Friends of John of Gaunt News Update
