SEND information

Just a small update for our families with children on our SEND register.

You will have been used to having 3 updates a year to review your child's learning support plan (LSP). This will still be the case but we are just moving the timings slightly. Instead of these reviews being at the start of each term they will move to being reviewed at the half term point instead. This will have a big impact at the start of an academic year as it will give them a chance to settle into their new classes and with their new teachers before making new plans.

To this end it means that this term LSP's will be reviewed at May half term and teachers will contact you shortly after to make meetings either in person or via the telephone.

Miles for March

We were so proud of how well our Year 2 children undertook this challenge and some of them enjoyed it so much that Mr Blake is continuing this on a Friday lunchtime for the Summer term.

A massive thank you to those Year 2 families who got sponsorship for this we raised a phenomenal £1,380.75. Which will be transferred into the friends bank account.

This means we will be able to go ahead to organise some lovely events for the children and in turn raise more money for our school so that we can do more things.

Summer term uniform

Just a reminder that as the weather gets warmer (hopefully) across the course of the term then children are welcome to wear blue gingham dresses or grey shorts. On PE days they can wear their sports shorts instead of leggings or tracksuit bottoms.

During the Summer term we do use outside more for PE so they will need plimsolls or trainers (velcro only please) so that they are not doing PE in their school shoes.

On warm days please think about hats, suncream and water bottles.

Punctuality

Just a little reminder that school starts at 8.50am and finished at 3.10pm.

We have noticed an increase in lateness over this term which does have an impact on the children both in terms of their feelings and their learning. Turning up late to class when all the rest are settled is an uncomfortable feeling for a child.

Being late also has an impact on office staff who need to deliver children to their classroom, update registers and order dinners.

Please try to be ready on the playgrounds for 8.50am so that your child can go in with all their friends and start their day as they should.

On another note if you are late, please do not drive into the school grounds to drop your child off - you still need to park off site and walk in.



Studybugs

Hopefully you have all received communication about our new system called Studybugs which is primarily used for attendance. By downloading the app on your mobile phone you will be able to message us to

report your child absent rather than phoning in and leaving a message. Studybugs will also give you some helpful NHS guidance too.

I am delighted to see that over 50 of you have already downloaded the app and registered with Studybugs but we really do need everyone to do this. The app icon is like the one above but without the words.

Studybugs is not just for reporting attendance, we are also able to communicate with you through it via texts and emails which will be more user friendly than our current system. In time we will stop using Teachers2Parents and everything will come through Studybugs.

We will also be more able to keep you updated with your child's current attendance more regularly as we know that attendance at school is vitally important and missing time at school has a negative impact on a child's education.

Bure Valley and Aylsham High school are also using Studybugs so this is a system that will carry on through your child's schooling.

Just a couple of reminders:
