- Using senses boxes they will explore what senses are and be able to then say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

History

- The children will learn about significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. They will focus on Florence Nightingale and the impact she had on modern nursing and Edith Cavell a nurse from our locality and her work in World War I. They will be able to compare the two nurses.
- They will learn about events beyond living memory that are significant globally by using drama and hot seating to understand how Edith Cavell helped soldiers in World War I.
- The children will take part in Remembrance Day activities to understand the global significance of World War I.
- They will write a fact file about Walter Tull the most celebrated black soldier from World War I.

Computing

- The children will understand that data can be represented in picture format.
- They will collect data on transport to school to create a pictogram.
- They will also use a pictogram to record the results of an experiment

PE

- The children will perform dances using simple movement patterns.
- They will create multiple standing and floor shapes.
- Our focus is on 'Social' and developing dynamic balance to agility - jumping and landing.

Art

Mark Making

- The children will investigate the possibilities of a range of different mark makers (pencils and pastels).
- They will make own tools for mark making using found materials (natural and man-made)
- They will create and use a different surface for mark makina.
- Children will understand and experiment painting with a paintbrush.
- They will imitate and create art in the style of Paul Klee.
